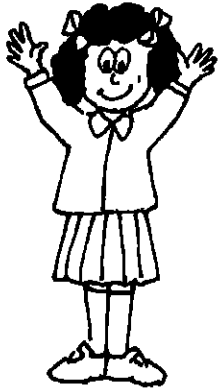

Paying Taxes to Caesar

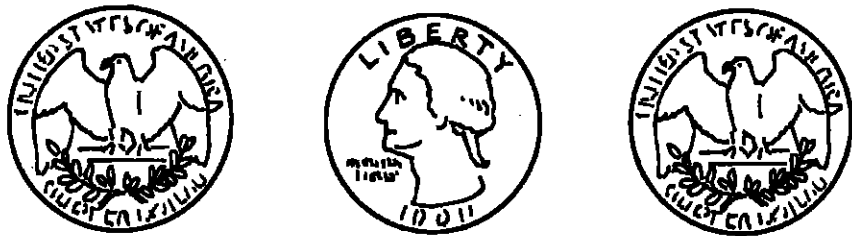
Some leaders asked Jesus if they should pay their taxes.

Find 5 coins ① hidden here.



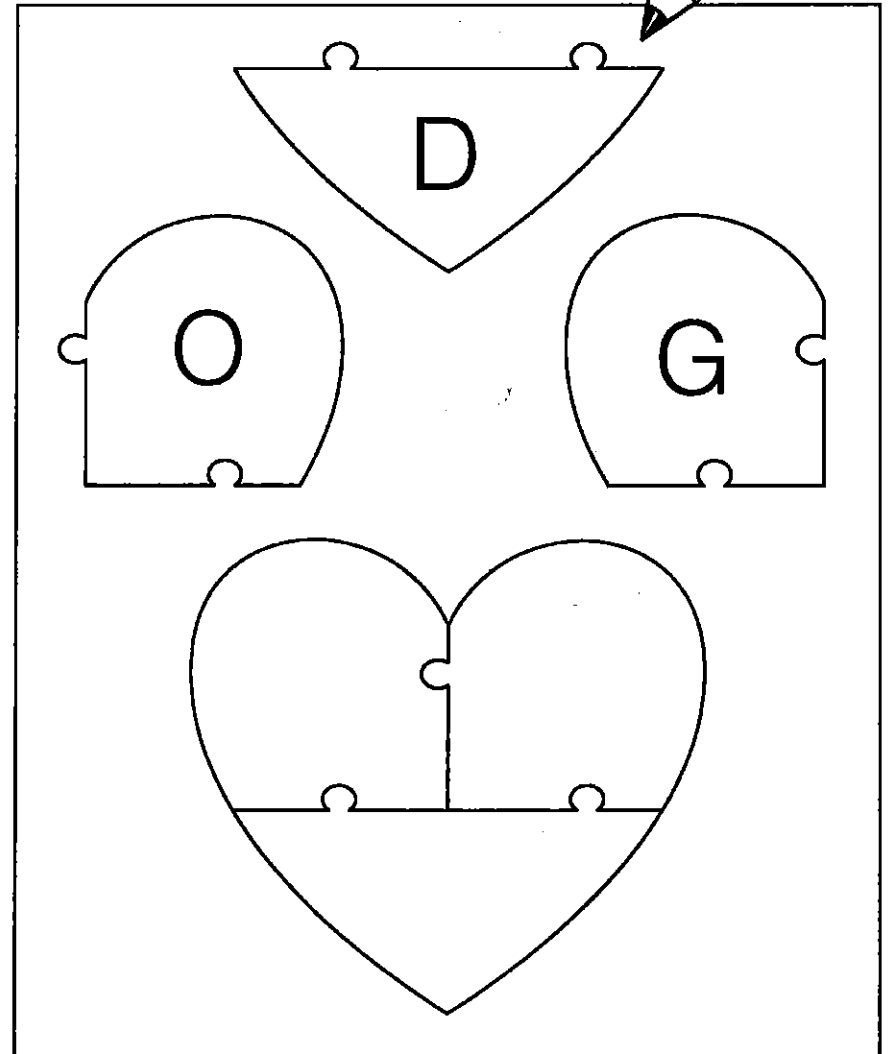
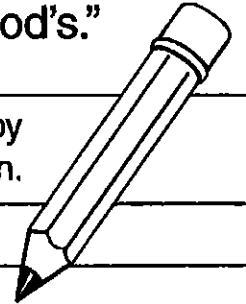
Jesus asked them to show Him a coin.

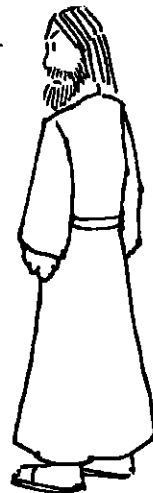
