Introduction: Paul is in the midst of a very practical section. He is explaining how we as followers of Christ should conduct our lives. As we come to chapter 13 he focuses on our responsibility as citizens.

- 1. This was a serious issue in the 1st century.
  - The Jews tended to be anti-Roman.
  - Christians worshipped Christ as Savior & King
  - Both Christians & Jews practiced separation from the immorality of Roman culture.
- 2. For the Romans, guidance was even more urgent because they lived in Rome.
- 3. For us, it is an equally important issue.
  - We want to protect our testimony before the world.
  - We are privileged to have a participatory system of government where we can influence legislation.
- 4. As we understand Paul's teaching here, we can be the kind of citizen God wants us to be.
