Introduction: As we come to Romans 15, Paul is wrapping up his focus on how the body of Christ can maintain unity despite the tremendous diversity that exists within the body.

- 1. Paul's answer to resolving conflict was learning to accept each other.
- 2. Last week we learned our ability to accept one another increases as we better understand each other.
- 3. As we turn to chapter 15 & Paul closes this section, he introduces another guide that leads to greater acceptance.
- 4. Paul calls the Romans to be Christlike.
- 5. The more we relate to others in Christlike ways, we are better able to overcome our differences, maintain unity & fulfill the purpose of the church.
- 6. Question: What does it mean to be Christlike in our relationships?
- 7. Paul will focus on two principles Christ modeled in His relationships.

- 1. The biggest obstacle to unity is self.
- 2. The greater the sense of self, the greater the chance of conflict & division.
- 3. That's why Paul calls us to Christlikeness.
- 4. It's a call to self-denial, taking up the cross & following Christ.
- 5. The more we display the selflessness & servant mindset of Christ ... the more our relationships will flourish ... that glorifies God & is attractive to others!
