## Romans: Theology 101

"Time For a Checkup" Romans 15:14-29

Introduction: As we come to scripture this morning, it is important to understand the context for this passage.

- 1. Paul has been focused on healthy relationships.
- 2. I believe he understood the greatest vulnerability the church faced.
- 3. Jesus had promised He would build His church & the gates of hades shall not overpower it. Think about that promise.
  - Hades is the Abode of the Dead
  - Gates Represent Authority, Power
  - The Gates of Hades Represents Satan's Power & the Consequence of Sin, Death
- 4. The church, built on the death, burial & resurrection of Jesus Christ is able to break Satan's grip on mankind.
- 5. The church is not invincible; a house divided cannot stand.
- 6. Division has always been the achilles heel of the church. That's why Paul spent so much time focused on healthy relationships.
- 7. In today's text he completes this focus & transitions toward the end of his letter. As he does, he shares important truths we can use to evaluate ourselves & our church.
