Introduction: The overwhelming theme of Micah is discipline.

- 1. As we've seen already, it wasn't entirely negative. Micah weaves messages of hope throughout his book.
- 2. In addition, we should always recognize the purpose of God's discipline is always corrective.
- 3. He is not out to harm His people; He intends to restore them. That's why Micah begins this action with a call to heed the rod.
- 4. The problem with discipline is the pain we don't like it because it hurts.
- 5. We've all been there. Here's what we must understand.
  - Resisting, trying to evade or escape discipline is even more painful.
- 6. This is the point Micah makes today. That's why wisdom heeds the rod.
