- 4. The key verse is found in Esther 4:14.
- 5. Despite its uniqueness, the book carries a powerful message & is filled with many practical applications that are as viable today as in Esther's day.
- 6. They remind us, history is "His story" & demonstrates how God can take care of us when we trust Him.
- 7. As we begin our study, we see how God moved in the Persian Empire to make Esther's future as the queen possible.
