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Introduction: Throughout our study of Esther, we have seen God at work.

- 1. Chapter 7 is no exception. In fact, here we see much of what God has been doing come to fruition.
- 2. Haman has been plotting against the Jews since chapter 3.
- 3. As recently as chapter 5, it looked like his plans would prevail.
- 4. Looks can be deceiving. In chapter 6 we saw the tables begin to turn on Haman.
  - The king was reminded of Mordecai's heroics.
  - Mordecai was honored.
  - Haman was humiliated.
- 5. From Haman's perspective, it couldn't get worse ... but it could.
- Here in chapter 7, he will die on the gallows he prepared for Mordecai.
- 7. It took a while, but once again we are reminded, we reap what we sow.

Conclusion: When you pause at this point in the narrative, you realize how satisfying this kind of reversal of fortune is.

- 1. All too often in a broken world, evil triumphs & the righteous suffer. But not here. Haman was evil & has gotten what he deserves.
- 2. The story isn't over, the Jews are still scheduled for extermination, but the tables have turned.
- 3. Soon we will see righteousness rewarded.
- 4. Right now, you may be in the dark, feeling as if God has abandoned you. The reality is:
  - Our circumstances are not accidental but providential.
  - God is active in our crises, but never in a hurry.
  - As we trust Him, the results are not coincidence.
  - They are God's sovereign will being done.
- So, instead of questioning God's character or motives, trust Him.
