Introduction:

The Western Church appears to be in trouble. Major denominations are arguing and dividing over Biblical truths vs. societal "tolerance". The number of people who regularly attend a church is dropping as people reject the need to even go to church ... and the church seems to be losing its social and moral influence in society ... perhaps it is time to ask what exactly is wrong?

Some Surprising Statistics:

Only 51% of people polled believe in a traditional view of God, 56% think Satan is an influential spiritual being, but 49% are not sure the Biblical God exists. 44% believe Jesus did not live a sinless life but did in fact sin while living as a man. People said they went to church for encouragement in order to leave feeling good about themselves. 32% often left church feeling disappointed and 44% said they left feeling guilty. "Church hopping" and even simply not attending church are a growing trend. Perhaps it is time we asked ourselves "Why do I attend church?" "What exactly am I looking for?"
