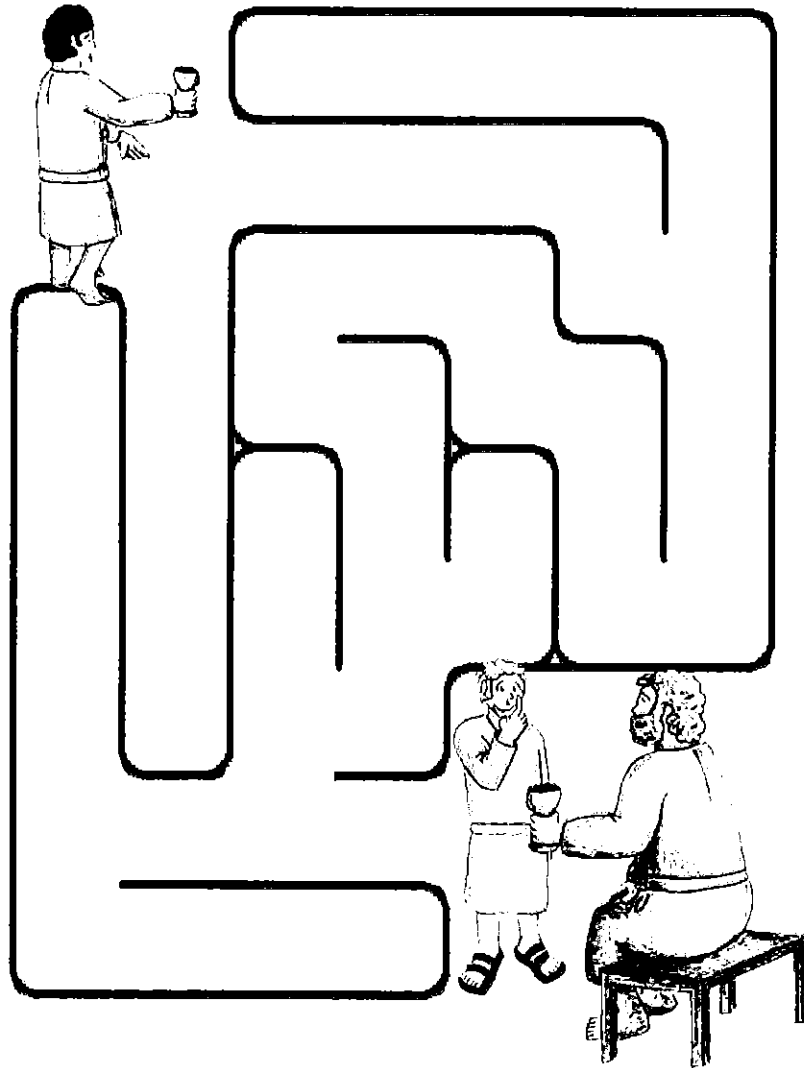

When the wine ran out, Mary came and told Jesus. He said that his time had not yet come. But Mary said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

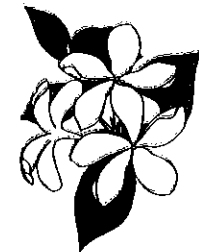
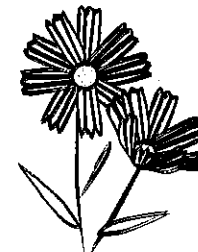
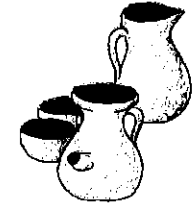
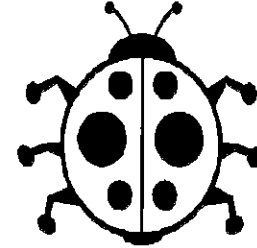
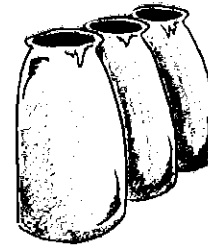


→ Find 5 differences between these pictures.

Jesus' first miracle was at Cana in Galilee. There he showed his glory and his disciples believed in him.

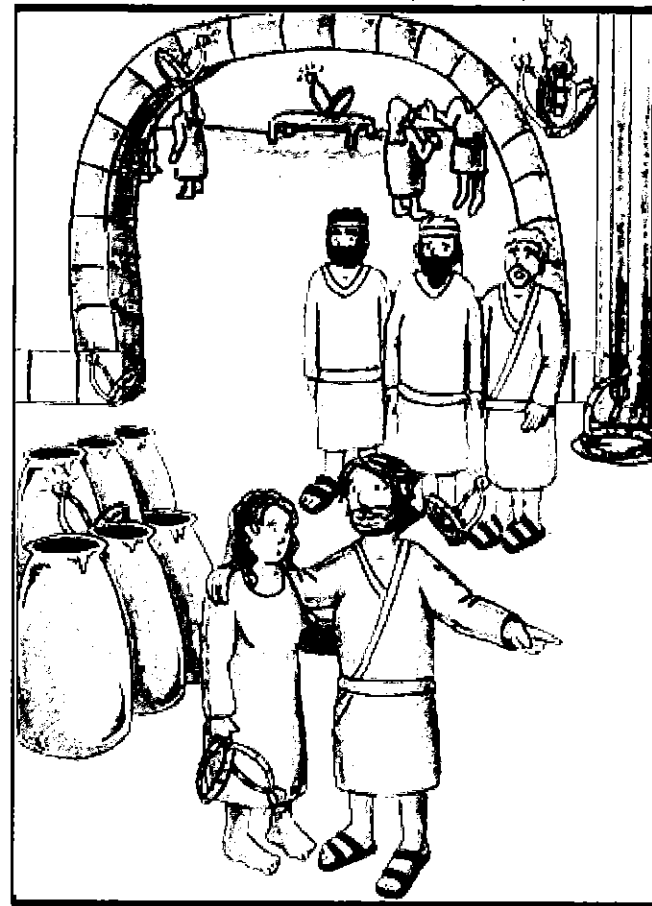

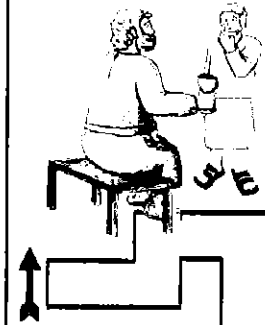
