Introduction: We are now in our final section of our study where Paul is focused on the practical issues we Christians face in everyday life. In today's text, the issue is: "What does freedom look like?"

- 1. It's a good question. Many have an incomplete, superficial understanding of freedom.
- 2. They focus on constraint, limits, restrictions & regulations, thinking the absence of such things is freedom.
- 3. There is an element of truth there, but there is also a very real danger.
- 4. We live in a "present evil age", we live in a "body of death", without some kind of restraint, we will likely self-destruct.
- 5. The issue becomes what kind of restraint is needed & effective.
- 6. Paul answers those kinds of questions in this very practical section.
- 7. He starts by focusing on love.
