Introduction: It's taken a while, but today we close out our study in Galatians.

- 1. Throughout his letter, Paul has focused on the dangers of legalism.
- 2. The Judaizers were intent on imposing the law onto Gentile believers.
- 3. As a result, Paul wrote with a real sense of urgency.
- 4. As he wrote, he had defended himself, the gospel, Christian liberty & forcefully called the Galatians back to that freedom.
- 5. In his mind the Galatians had been deceived.
- Now, some 2,000 years later, the specifics have changed, but our vulnerability to deception has not.
- 7. Every day we are bombarded with misinformation meant to influence us to lead us astray from our commitment to Christ.
- 8. This reality makes the need for clarity essential.
- 9. As we are bombarded with data, we need to see the truth clearly so we can walk in that truth.
- 10. So, as we close our study, may I ask, "Do you have clarity in your relationship in Christ?"
- 11. Clarity is available through discerning evaluation.
