Leaving A Legacy: A Study In 2 Timothy

"Encouragement" 2 Timothy 1:1-7

Introduction: Today we begin a new study where we will work though the book of 2 Timothy.

- 1. 2 Timothy is a very personal book, written from a Roman prison by Paul to Timothy, who was overseeing the work in Ephesus.
- 2. The context is the key to understanding this letter.
 - In A.D. 61, Paul is released from the Roman imprisonment recorded in Acts.
 - Paul visits Ephesus, leaving Timothy to oversee the work.
 - He travels to Macedonia where he writes 1 Timothy.
 - He then visits Crete, leaving Titus to oversee the work there.
 - He travels to Nicopolis where he writes Titus.
 - He may have taken a fourth missionary journey.
 - He visits Troas, is rearrested, and eventually martyred.
- 3. Paul knows he is about to die; this letter suggests he sees Timothy as his successor, so these words are important.
- 4. He knows what Timothy is facing, he knows Timothy's makeup, so he begins by encouraging Timothy.
