Introduction: We are three weeks into a journey where the destination we seek is restoration.

- 1. We've covered a lot of ground:
 - Identified The Problem
 - Recognized Christ Is The Only Answer
 - Learned We Must Make A Personal Commitment
- 2. This is a huge step, but it is not the end of our journey. In many respects it's only the beginning.
- 3. The bible describes the moment we surrender to Christ as being "born again". The point being, now that we have new life in Christ, it is time to grow.
- 4. Paul describes that process as a combination of "putting off" and "putting on".
- 5. We'll focus on "putting off" this morning.
- 6. As we'll see, this involves learning to confess our sin.
