## "Cornelius: A Soldier For God" Acts 10-11

Introduction: Today we will conclude our study on ordinary people who did extraordinary things for God.

- 1. We met some very special people.
- Our last focus will be on Cornelius.
- 3. He is only mentioned in Acts 10 where we learn:
  - He was a Roman Centurion.
  - He was a part of the Italian Cohort.
  - He was a God-fearing Gentile.
  - He was known and respected in the Jewish community.
  - God had a plan for his life.
- 4. In Acts 1:8 we find how God envisioned the spread of the gospel.
- Up to this point Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria had received the gospel. It was only a matter of time before the gospel would reach the Gentiles.
- 6. I doubt we can appreciate what a huge step this would be.
- 7. Jews saw Gentiles as barbarians and wanted nothing to do with them.
- 8. For Gentiles to be accepted into the church, God will have to do a lot of convincing.
- 9. This is where God used Cornelius.
- 10. He is the one God used to break down that barrier and protect the unity of the church.

- 2. In the very near future the church would grapple with "large numbers of Gentiles turning to Christ.
- 3. But because of Cornelius and Peter's involvement, God had prepared His people to deal with the explosive moment.
- 4. Now, some 2,000 years later, Gentiles make up the majority of the people of God.
- 5. But that reality starts with Cornelius.
- 6. God used him to break down barriers and protect unity.
- 7. He's a great example for us to follow.
